In an effort to provide timely and accurate information to our students, staff, and faculty members, the following information is being provided to you so that you can make informed decisions about your safety.

On Friday, November 30, two female students reported being drugged and sexually assaulted by a known acquaintance at a fraternity house on campus on November 29, 2018.

The female students are receiving medical care and will receive support and assistance from the university. Both female students have declined to report to law enforcement at this time. Every sexual assault incident is different for each individual, and the university supports and respects the decisions made by the student involved on how they wish to proceed.

Information we want you to know about your safety and the safety of all Volunteers.

- Putting drugs in someone else's drink is crime.
- Drug facilitated sexual assault occurs, but alcohol remains the #1 drug used to facilitate sexual assault.
- Do not let your own alcohol or drug use keep you from reporting, the only person responsible for sexual assault is the perpetrator.
- If you are drinking, do not drink from a common source, take a drink from someone else, or leave your drink unattended.
- Be an active bystander. If you see something that doesn't look right, acknowledge the situation and safely intervene. Volunteers speak up!
