

Clery Compliance

The University of Tennessee has identified over 2,000 <u>Campus</u> <u>Security Authorities</u>. When a <u>crime defined in the Clery Act</u> is reported to a Campus Security Authority, those persons are required to report this information to the Campus Clery Coordinator, regardless of whether or not that crime has been reported to or investigated by police. If the Campus Clery Coordinator determines that the incident, as reported to them, poses an ongoing threat to the campus community, they are required to issue a <u>Timely Warning (or "Safety</u> <u>Notice")</u> to the campus community.

On Wednesday, August 28, a student reported to a non-law enforcement Campus Security Authority that she was sexually assaulted on Lake Avenue on Monday night, August 26. The female student declined to report the incident to police or the university; however, other resources were made available to her. Every sexual assault incident is different for each individual, and the university supports and respects the decisions made by the student involved on how they wish to proceed.

The <u>Clery Act</u> requires the university to notify the campus community of certain criminal activity that occurs on university owned or controlled property. In addition, the university is required to provide safety tips that may aid in the prevention of similar crimes. The intent of a warning regarding a criminal incident(s) is to enable individuals to protect themselves. For Safety Notices and Clery statistics, crimes are classified according to the regulations of the Clery Act mandated by the Department of Education. Though state law may categorize an incident differently, <u>Clery definitions and classifications</u> are strictly followed when labeling an incident for Clery reporting purposes.
