



Clery Compliance

In an effort to provide timely and accurate information to our students, staff, and faculty members, the following information is being provided to you so that you can make informed decisions about your safety. The content of this notice includes sexual assault

On Friday, August 23, a student contacted the UT Police Department in reference to a rape that occurred in a residence hall on the west side of campus around 12:30 a.m.

A student met with a fellow student at an off-campus location and then returned to the fellow student's residence hall. The student, earlier in the evening, told the fellow student they did not want to have sex; however, the fellow student proceeded to disregard that set boundary that was established.

The student has declined a police report at this time and is receiving resources and support.

Every sexual assault incident is different for each individual, and the university supports and respects the decisions made by the student involved on how they wish to proceed.

Information we want you to know about your safety and the safety of all Volunteers.

- Report any and all suspicious activity to police as soon as you are aware of it.

- Eight out of ten sexual assaults are by a known offender. For more information on sexual assault statistics visit <https://www.rainn.org/statistics>.
- Consent is an active agreement to participate. If you engage in sexual activity, be sure you understand your partner's limits, and communicate your own limits clearly. Don't engage in sexual activities without clear consent from your partner.
- A sexual assault is never the victim's fault. The only person responsible for sexual misconduct is the perpetrator.

The [Clery Act](#) requires the university to notify the campus community of certain criminal activity that occurs on university owned or controlled property. In addition, the university is required to provide safety tips that may aid in the prevention of similar crimes. The intent of a warning regarding a criminal incident(s) is to enable individuals to protect themselves.

For Safety Notices and Clery statistics, crimes are classified according to the regulations of the Clery Act mandated by the Department of Education. Though state law may categorize an incident differently, [Clery definitions](#)
