

## Clery Compliance

In an effort to provide timely and accurate information to our students, staff, and faculty members, the following information is being provided to you so that you can make informed decisions about your safety.

The university has received three separate incidents of fondling that occurred on Friday, November 1 and Saturday, November 2, 2024. Two incidents occurred in Neyland Stadium, and another in an on-campus residence hall, west side of campus. Though these incidents are unrelated and did not involve the same parties, due to the frequency of reports, we are making the community aware.

Two of the incidents declined a police report, and the third is being investigated.

# Information we want you to know about your safety and the safety of all Volunteers.

- Report criminal incidents as soon as possible so appropriate measures
  can be taken for your safety and the safety of others. You can report via the
  Safe at UT app or by calling UTPD at 865-974-3111. Download the app from
  the <u>UT website</u>.
- If you see something that doesn't look right, or makes you feel concerned, please report that as well.
- On game day, you can report suspicious activity in Neyland by texting 865-974-9898 with their seat location (concourse, section, row, seat number) and issue.

- The University defines consent as an active agreement to participate. An
  active agreement is defined as words and/or conduct that communicate a
  person's willingness to participate. (<u>Policy on Sexual Harassment, Sexual Assault, Dating and Domestic Violence, and Stalking</u>).

The <u>Clery Act</u> requires the university to notify the campus community of certain criminal activity that occurs on university owned or controlled property. In addition, the university is required to provide safety tips that may aid in the prevention of similar crimes. The intent of a warning regarding a criminal incident(s) is to enable individuals to protect themselves.

For Safety Notices and Clery statistics, crimes are classified according to the regulations of the Clery Act mandated by the Department of Education. Though state law may categorize an incident differently, <u>Clery definitions</u> and <u>classifications</u> are strictly followed when labeling an incident for Clery reporting purposes.
